Penrith Show results

With entries across all sections, the first ever Penrith Virtual Show was judged a success by organisers – with some of the biggest class entries coming from the rabbit section and the arable competition.

Chairman Richard Utting said “A virtual show replacing a real live show was an unknown, but we wanted to do something different, giving sponsors and competitors an opportunity to prepare entries and show off their exhibits.

“Dry Stone Walling is a real art form and a great spectacle at the show – and for a change, we were able to see competitors working on walls they built across the countryside. It is always a well-supported competition and this year is no different. It’s a craft that rarely requires any social distancing!
